TEETHING PROBLEMS WITH THE NEW TOILET CUBICLES

There are a number of teething problems with the new toilet cubicles which are gradually being addressed:

Storage bins for spare toilet rolls have been provided (please replace a roll if you use one up).

A different type of toilet roll holder will be installed which should make this easier.

The ventilation system is inadequate as the exhaust fans only run when the lights are on: we are considering connecting them to a thermostat so that they also run whenever the space gets hot. Alternatively vents could be inserted into cut-outs at the base of the doors.

NEW FREEZER

If you haven't noticed already, there is a new small freezer in the corner near the large fridge, where there was an extremely ancient and disused bar fridge. Club Steward **Andy Stanford** has stocked it with icecreams and Zooper Doopers—most welcome on hot days!

We have received an *R-Core* Custom Bow grips "club pack" of sample bow grips. Our members can touch and feel them and then perhaps order a custom grip. They are on the table in the clubroom.

Louise Kennedy has been able to source cardboard and can continue to supply it. It is of a suitable size. Jeff Nicoll also provided more, as our regular source has come back from their Christmas break! (The cardboard is used to back the target faces, and we go through a huge amount)

The club has a bucket of miscellaneous arrows in the cupboard – they are used as hot spares, so are needed!

It has been suggested that the club should purchase a lefthanded compound bow; Ken Osborne as been asked to purchase one.

ARE YOU CURIOUS ABOUT THESE VERY DIFFERENT FORMS OF SHOOTING? PERHAPS YOU WOULD LIKE A CHANGE FROM SHOOTING AT THE SAME OLD TARGETS FROM THE SAME OLD DISTANCES?



Archers shoot varying distances depending on bow type and gender, from 100m for the younger juniors to 185m for male compounders. This is one time when you can aim for the sky, *right*, and (particularly long bow and bare bow) see your arrow going way-y-y-y up high before dropping down on the target (hopefully) or maybe not.....

Chris has given you a fair idea of what is involved with shooting *field*. The other option is *clout*.

This is long-distance shooting at a circular target laid out on the ground, a form of competition practiced for centuries. The centre of the target was formerly a patch of cloth (clout). Nowadays it is a solid triangle, and scores 10. It can be seen in this photo, *left*, as well as the coloured flags that denote the size of the virtual target that is flat on the ground.



Scoring involves having a number of people moving in a circle and each collecting arrows that have fallen within a particular zone—gold, red, blue etc. Each archer then calls out to the recorders the scores for their own arrows, *left*. Yes, it sounds a bit complicated, but it all works out in the end!
